Colleagues and peers in the Sacramento ICU recognize that certification demonstrates a commitment to excellence in nursing professional practice and lifelong learning.

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## How to get certified

#### **Represented nurses**

Two ways to get reimbursed:

- 1. Bargained benefit covers eligible certification and recertification exam fees (see website).
- 2. \$3,000/year National Tuition Reimbursement benefit covers certification exam fees and prep courses.

#### Non-represented nurses

\$3,000/year National Tuition Reimbursement benefit covers certification exam fees and prep courses.

### Exam prep

Registered nurses in pursuit of advancing their clinical knowledge may have access to certification preparation courses located online in **KP HealthStream**.\*

- 40+ courses cover a wide variety of popular national certifications, including CCRN, CNOR, RN-NIC, and many more.
- Access to these courses is available 24/7 so that nurses can study at a time most convenient to their busy schedules.
