Florence Stroud, RN

During the AIDS epidemic, Florence Stroud, RN, authored guidelines concerning the prevention of prenatal transmission of HIV and the care of mothers and children infected with AIDS.

Florence is renowned as an advocate for the improvement of care, as well as an innovator of health care initiatives that addressed disparities. A UCSF professor and public health researcher, she twice served as interim director of the San Francisco Department of Public Health and was **the first African American to serve as health director for the City of Berkeley.**

Florence "Flo" Martin Stroud was born November 22, 1933 in Oklahoma and passed away on November 16, 2007 in Oakland, California.
