Learning Objectives

- Describe the needs of the newborn through understanding of how they adapt to life upon birth, and prepare for resuscitating, stabilizing, and transporting sick or preterm infants from lower care to higher care facility if needed
- Identify the symptoms of failure to adapt to the new environment by utilizing the standard S.T.A.B.L.E Mnemonic
- Apply interventions to promote safety and clinical care as the newborn transitions to the new environment
- Demonstrate advanced assessment, intervention & communication skills to monitor and treat the transitioning newborn in a timely manner based on standards of care

Provider Continuing Education will be offered to all RN staff and certificate of completion provided to all others in attendance. **Course Description**: S.T.A.B.L.E. is the most widely distributed and implemented neonatal education program to focus exclusively on the post-resuscitation/pre-transport stabilization care of sick infants. Based on a mnemonic to optimize learning, retention and recall of information, S.T.A.B.L.E. stands for the <u>six assessment and care modules</u> in the program: Sugar, Temperature, Airway, Blood pressure, Lab work, and Emotional support. A seventh module, Quality Improvement stresses the professional responsibility of improving and evaluating care provided to sick infants.
